## **Description**

Look at the various types of risk that organisations face with fresh eyes by learning the terms and lexical sets to go with them. Express your attitudes towards risk-taking by practising word-building and idiomatic language. Importantly for your company, learn how to identify and prioritise risks, how to then communicate priorities, as well as to communicate about risk management effectively to stakeholders and take decisions about whether to venture them or not.

## What will I be able to do after this Award?

#### **SPEAKING**

- o Express own attitudes and check with others that an offered reason is actually a good reason
- o Practise a range of devices to add to a point, show consequence, and eliminate hesitation
- Emphasise, summarise, and persuade during a damage control meeting roleplay
- Present a text you have read by identifying the main ideas, linking to what the audience already knows, paraphrasing, and separating one's own views from the writer's

#### **LISTENING**

- o Complete a spidergram by listening to the five types of risk and examples
- o Clearly hear numbered steps, examples and commentary about examples.
- o Eliminate difficulty listening to multiple speakers having a brainstorming meeting
- o Prepare notes and listen out for the context of each expression used in a meeting, as well as for which expressions are not used

## **READING**

- o Skim an audio script for key words and phrases used to structure a response confirm ideas by reading for gist, and to prepare a summary of the key points in a set of numbered examples
- o Read a case study to plan how to deal with the criticisms on behalf of a company

## **VOCABULARY & ACCURACY**

- o Learn adjectives and verbs that go with 'risk'
- o Use adverbs suitably, either as modifiers or intensifiers
- o Insert common idiomatic phrases into everyday conversation

#### WRITING

- o Create dialogues from a set of modifiers/intensifiers and adjectives
- Prepare a report for the CEO of a company analysing and rating a number of risks
- Practise summary, reporting, and persuasion in a single text
