What will I be able to do after this Award?

SPEAKING

- o Touch base with team members using appropriate questions and answers to identifying the source of a problem and proposing a solution
- o Roleplay a problem-solving conversation in the roles of manager and team member and practise crisis management techniques, stages, phrases, and culturally different approaches
- o Participate in a summit between the World Bank, NGOs and the energy industry and debate the continued financing of fossil fuels
- o Structure arguments by stating an issue, stating the most important point, sequencing arguments, adding arguments to strengthen a point, conceding points, and concluding

LISTENING

o Hone in on the problems raised in three sample dialogues and the phrases used to resolve them

READING

- o Employ awareness of textual structure to locate the correct summary for each paragraph, and to scan quickly for relevant detail
- o Analyse visual information from a curve graph and compare it with information gleaned from an article
- o Give data to defend comparisons drawn using signposting phrases as well as verbs, adjectives and adverbs that usually fall in connection with numbers and figures

VOCABULARY & ACCURACY

- Understand the differences between conditionals then build mixed conditional sentences
- o Make notes to share with a partner about things planned in the past and not done, and something dreamt about but impossible to do now, using the third conditional

WRITING

- o Summarise points mentioned in an expert's talk and politely recommend follow-up action in an e-mail to company managers
- o Use tricks for lowering the word count in summaries
- o Outline a future energy policy the World Bank will be advised to adopt and flesh it out in a report
